

### RELIGIOUS STUDIES

Course: OCR A-Level Religious Studies

### INTRODUCTION

Your A Level Course is split into three components (each component is tested in a 2 hour paper) which collectively make up one A level grade. The three components are: Philosophy of Religion, Religion and Ethics and Developments in Christian thought.

## PAPER 1 THE PHILOSOPHY OF RELIGION: TASKS

In your first year of study, you will consider questions such as 'how do I know what is true?', 'can we prove God's existence?' and 'Am I more than just my body?' through the lenses of many ancient and modern philosophers.

#### PLATO'S UNDERSTANDING OF REALITY

- Research 'Plato's analogy of the cave' if you type this into google or youtube, there will a wide array of resources available
- Summarise his analogy into ten bullet points
- Write one paragraph explaining what this tells us about Plato's view of the relationship between the body and the soul

### MIND, BODY SOUL

- Read through the 'brain in the vat' scenario sheet.
   This is a common example used when studying the 'mind, body, soul' part of the course
- Summarise the thought experiment into 5 bullet points and then answer the questions below:
- What does the 'brain in the vat' experiment suggest about the relationships between the mind/ soul and the body?
- Do you think it is possible to still be 'ourselves' without our bodies?

### PAPER 2 RELIGION & ETHICS: TASKS

The second component of A-Level religious studies looks at five major ethical theories and applies them to situations such as Euthanasia, business ethics and sexual ethics.

- Research the Philosopher Thomas Aquinas (a major thinker across all three components of the course) and create a fact file on him. Include details about key events in his life, two of his beliefs about God and the main aims of his work

# PAPER 3 DEVELOPMENTS IN CHRISTIAN THOUGHT: TASKS

The final component of the A level looks at developments in Christian theology beginning with the doctrine of the Fall and original sin and ending in year 13 with the study of gender theology and Marxism

- Read the accounts of Genesis 1-3 The creation and fall of Man – it can be found here: <a href="https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Genesis+1-3&version=NIV">https://www.biblegateway.com/passage/?search=Genesis+1-3&version=NIV</a>
- Draw a table to show what is different BEFORE and AFTER the fall in the following 3 categories:
  - Adam and Eve's relationship with each other
  - \* Adam and Eve's relationship with God
  - \* Adam and Eve's relationship with the earth

- Use quotes where possible to support the points you are making, then complete the questions below:
  - \* What does the story of the Fall in Genesis 3 suggest about the impact of Adam and Eve being tempted by the serpent?
  - \* How might this story be used to support the Christian view that all people are dependent on God for their salvation?
